FREUDENSTADE, Germany, 11th August, 1961 - The inscription on the pillow in Dr. Buchman's room is a poem written by his brother:

"He lives, he lives in all the past. He lives, nor to the last Of seeing him again will I despair. In dreams I see him now

And upon his angel brow
I see it writ 'Thou shalt meet me there'."

The photographs beside his bed are of his mother and father. There also are his Bible and glasses. The cane was a gift from Prince Adalbert of Prussia whose widow spoke at the demonstration in the Kursaal.
