OCT 2017 TAIWAN / MANILA TOUR

ASIAN BEAT PROJECT

I was in charge of the Taiwan/Manila tour this time and I am happy to report on this project. We visited Taichung and Taipei from Oct 28th to Nov 2nd, and Manila from Nov 2nd to 5th in 2017. 19 people from Japan, 10 from Taiwan, 1 from the Philippines and 5 OCA staff members participated in this tour.

Preparation for summer camp and tour

When I visited Taiwan to rehearse in May, my first impression of the Taiwan Cast was there were a bit quiet but they loved to dance.

We had a summer camp at the end of August to gather all cast members from the three countries - Japan, Taiwan, and the Philippines. At first they were nervous, but the tension gradually disappeared. In the evening of the first day, we had a campfire. I noticed they were enjoying love talks in different languages. I felt very happy about it.

One theme of the camp is how to convey each other's goodness without relying on words. In order to make "Friendship beyond nationality and language", we value verbal

communication less than "feeling" and "pleasure" in a common language of dance & games.

By doing so, they can enjoy this international exchange program more.

After the summer camp, each cast practiced at home until the tour started. The 19-member Japanese team gathered from all over Japan and had rehearsals and workshops 3-5 hours a day for three days. In order to create Japanese performance, we combined a variety of cultural works taking advantage of each other's different personalities.



At the same time, we introduced a workshop which set up a "challenge zone" to look deeply at their own personal growth. Now we were ready for the tour.

The visit to Taiwan, the Philippines - Filled with excitement

The cast members deepened their friendships day by day. It seemed like they didn't waste any time-being together for only nine days. In addition, I think that one of our big achievements was utilizing the day duty system which encouraged cooperation and empowered each cast member as a part of the team.



At Taichung University of Science and Technology, we had an exchange program with 100 college students like last year. At Dayeh University, 500 students enjoyed our show. At the Aletheia University in Taipei, 100 students enjoyed a dance party with rock bands and dance groups.

After finishing the program in Taiwan, we visited the Philippines for the first time. Ms. Raquel Nakayama spoke about her life and many of us were impressed and learned a lot. Her message encouraged young people who face difficulties in their lives. The dance party was the biggest highlight. The fun and excitement of that night has become a very precious memory that symbolized this program. I appreciate everyone in the Philippines who made this program succeed.

Results of this year and future developments

As for the Common Beat Taiwan Performance in May 2018, we want to make it succeed by maximizing the relationships with the Taiwan team which we have built through Asian Beat. Then it will also raise their interest in the 2018 Asian Beat Program. I want to use this big trend to the momentum of the program. Also, by inviting Korean cast members to the Asian Beat Program, we can expand the diversity of casts and create more interesting programs.

Even now after the tour has finished, the cast members have been exchanging messages through LINE. How nice if this could be the start of '50 years of friendship' like Mr. Takahashi did. Then we could call this program successful in building lasting friendships.

The theme of this year's program was "Bond". Two weeks is a short time to spend together, but I think that friendships between cast members transcended nationalities and languages and strong bond was created.

It was an exciting program that was a bit different from the previous years. Thank you very much for your warm support and cooperation.

I am confident I can get along with people well although my communication skills are limited. I could connect with more people than anyone else in this Asian Beat Project. I want many people to join this program.



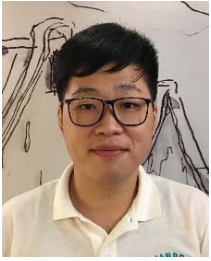
Mika Oshiro (Mika)
